On May 18, 2021, the popular Ape Cave Interpretive site will reopen to the public. The site was closed to the public in Spring 2020 in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and to implement a toilet replacement project, and has remained closed since that time. When Ape Cave reopens, visitors will be required to obtain a timed reservation ticket in advance of their visit.
